We are the main provider of NHS community health and care services across West Sussex, Brighton & Hove and the High Weald Lewes Havens area of East Sussex





Every day, our teams deliver essential medical, nursing and therapeutic care to over 9,000 adults, children and families.

The quality of care is our top priority. We care for most people in their own homes or as close to home as possible. This may be in a community hospital, or in the clinics and centres we run or work in.

We have around 5,000 staff. Most of them are expert clinicians (doctors, dentists, nurses and therapists), and they get great support from specialists in areas such as governance, medicines management, information technology, human resources, finance, facilities and estates.

As a team we focus on the delivery of safe and effective care, and on providing the best possible experience of our work – whether you are a patient, a carer or relative of a patient, a partner organisation, a commissioner of our services or a supplier.

Our services

The vast majority of NHS care is delivered in the community, either by family doctors (GPs) or by community health and care providers like us.

More than 1.3 million people live in the area we serve, and it is likely that a great many of them will come into contact with our services in some way across the year: as a patient, a carer or relative of a patient, or through a link with one of our staff members or volunteers.

Our health and care services include:

- Health visitors working with families with young children.
- School nurses caring for the school-age population.
- Specialist doctors, dentists, psychologists, nurses and therapists looking after children, young people and adults with complex health needs, mobility problems and long-term health conditions.
- Multidisciplinary community teams caring for the frail elderly, children, young people, and adults in their own home.
- Community hospitals providing inpatient care beds.
- Specialist clinicians caring for people at the end of their lives.

We care for some of the most vulnerable people in our communities across the age range. At all times we prioritise quality, compassionate care in the services we provide.

Our vision is to provide **excellent care at the heart of the community**. We see this as a straightforward statement that summarises in simple words what we are about.

It underpins all we do and inspires us to do the best for the people we serve. But we will only ever realise our vision by being true at all times to our values.
